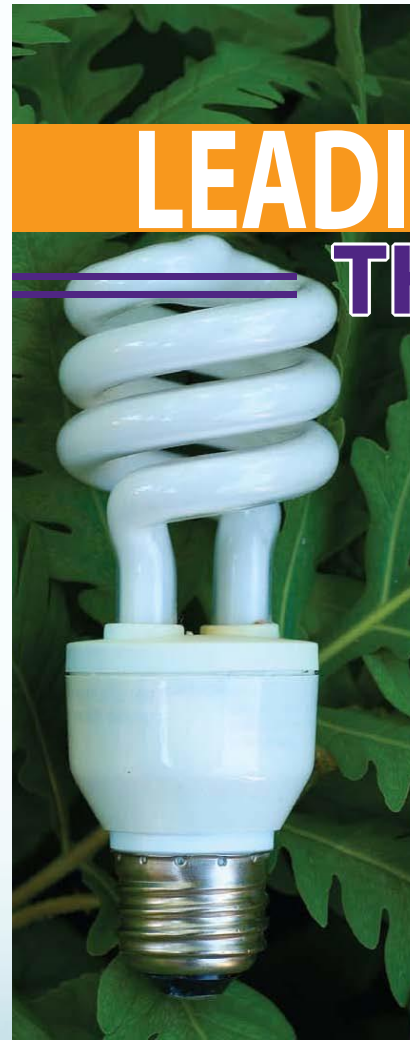
Clean Energy Leadership Task Force

- Meetings bring together about 75 people representing local towns, counties and villages, as well as local utilities and clean energy experts to discuss clean energy projects and policies.



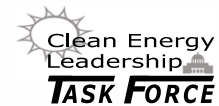

Hempstead



- LI's first hydrogen fueling station
- 3.6kw wind turbine that powers shellfish aquaculture facility
- 40kw solar on Town Hall

Smithtown

- First Town in NY to convert whole fleet of refuse trucks & non-emergency vehicles to natural gas
- 10 kw wind turbine just approved for recycling plant



Babylon

- Early adopter of many green policies
- The Babylon Project- for home retrofits
- Hybrids, and now Volts in fleets
- Large commercial buildings required to meet green building standards



Huntington



- • Town of Huntington obtained EPA's Energy Star Label rating for Town Hall in 2010
- Using ARRA funds to replace 4000 streetlights
